Through EDCF, Korea Eximbank has approved 36 bilateral projects with LAC countries and has supported seven co-financing projects with IDB, with total loan amount of 1,242 million dollars.



Korea Trade-Investment Promotion Agency(KOTRA) was established to contribute to the development of the national economy by performing work such as trade promotion, investment between domestic and foreign companies and support of industrial technology cooperation. With 129 offices located in 84 countries around the world including 12 countries in Latin America, KOTRA serves as a global business platform tailored to meet the needs of foreign buyers, investor and Korean entrepreneurs alike.

KOTRA strives to create new opportunities that further increase the trade and investment partnerships between Korean Small and Medium-sized enterprises(SMEs) and foreign enterprises through various trade promotion services, comprehensive support services for inbound and outbound investment, as well as employment support for a talented global workforce.

The main functions and roles of KOTRA also include Supporting for newly exporting companies, Expanding SMEs business in overseas markets with Business matchmaking, Global Market Information, Economic and Trade Cooperaiton, SME global business training & attracting foreign professionals, G2G service and Supporting International development cooperation.

Korea and LAC: An Agenda for Prosperity through Trade and Investment

Korea was the first East Asian country to seek Free Trade Agreements with LAC partners in the early 2000s, signing FTA with Chile (2004), Peru (2011), Colombia (2013) and Central America (2018). Trade between the two regions experienced a fast and sustained growth, increasing 9.2% per year on average between 2000 and 2018, while Korean investment in the region has expanded sixfold in the last decade alone. This panel will discuss the strategic alliance between Korea and LAC and how to optimize the effect of the FTAs based on the experiences of entrepreneurs and highlevel officials from both regions.

Latin American and Caribbean countries are actively pursuing to invest in construction, upgrade and maintenance of public infrastructure for economic and social growth and improve public services. The advent of the 4th Industrial Revolution is changing how we live. Additionally, E-commerce or the Digital Economy, is enabling entrepreneurs to reach a broader network of customers and access to global value chains. This is especially impactful in LAC as it has one of the highest internet penetration rates in the world, climbing from less than 5% being online in 2000 to 55% in 2017. 
